

## Trial holes at Associated Development sites

Survey notification – 15/3/22

Works to examine underground utilities infrastructure are set to take place on the A12 and local roads in Leiston in relation to the proposed Sizewell C nuclear power project.

From 21 March, contractors for the project will be digging trial holes at a number of locations to understand more about the depth and condition of the existing utilities infrastructure.

The works have been planned with local authorities and will inform the delivery of a number of the project's associated developments, including the proposed Two Villages Bypass, the Sizewell Link Road, and the Yoxford Roundabout, if Sizewell C progresses to construction.

All of the works on the A12 between Yoxford and Stratford St Andrew will take place overnight, between 7pm and 6am. Some traffic management will be required but there will be no road closures or diversions – only single lane closures and traffic lights.

Most of the trial holes in Leiston will be dug during the day but there is expected to be three nights of working. Traffic management will be required on Lover's Lane, Abbey Road, and King George's Street – again with single lane closures and traffic lights. A temporary speed restriction of 30mph will also be in place between the Potter's Street junction on Abbey Road and the turning to Sandy Lane on Lover's Lane.

The works are expected to take approximately four weeks to complete. Sizewell C is writing to residents living near to the locations of the trial holes to inform them.

Please note: This does not constitute the start of any road works or construction. Nor does the work imply that consent for the proposed development is assumed. The planning application for Sizewell C is being considered by the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy, with a decision expected to be announced in May.
